



## STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS









## ACADEMIC PROGRESS

The academic goal of Broadway Academy during the 2021-22 school year was to increase its Performance Index (PI) score by 20 points in Reading, Math, and Science, a goal that was met as evidenced by an exceptional increase in PI by over 30%. Broadway Academy significantly exceeding state expectations in student academic growth (5 Stars, Progress) and closing educational gaps (5 Stars, Gap Closing). Additionally, 100% of third graders met the state reading requirements to promote to Grade 4.

### YOY GROWTH IN PERFORMANCE INDEX SCORE





St. Aloysius, as the sponsor of this school, is legally mandated to provide oversight, monitoring, and technical assistance.
